# Philip's Focus

#### The Contrasting Images of Holy Week

This Sunday is Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday marks Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. This event is in all four Gospels Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-10, Luke 19:29-38, and John 19:29:38. Jesus came into Jerusalem on a humble donkey. An earthly king would have come in with pomp and circumstance mounting a magnificent horse. Jesus' humble entry becomes a celebration of a new Kingdom. The Palm Branches represent victory and triumph, though the final victory will not come until many varied events transpire. Jesus' entry into Jerusalem opens the door to the unfolding of many events: some festive, some misunderstood, and all events leading to the cross and resurrection.

Amazingly, all of these significant and emotional events of Holy Week only span a few days. This week accounts for over 20 percent of the message of the four Gospels. The events provide us many contrasting images to ponder the irony, purpose, and message. What are these contrasting images of Holy Week?

- Jesus' triumphant entry ⇔ Jesus' arrest and crucifixion
- Jesus' washing feet ⇔ Pilate washing his hands
- Peter claiming ultimate loyalty 

  Peter's denial
- Judas' concern for the poor 

  Judas betraying Jesus for 30 pieces of silver
- Crowd chanting "Hosanna" 
   ⇔ Crowd chanting "Crucify him"
- Jesus, sinless, crucified ⇔ Barabbas, guilty, released
- Disciples asked to stay awake 
   ⇔ Disciples asleep
- Fellowship of the Last Supper ⇔ Judas abruptly leaves to betray

These are some of the contrasting images of Holy Week out of the four Gospels. There are also contrasting emotions which include: hostility, peace; love, hate; unity, division; cheers, tears; and most of all death and resurrection.

Our journey through Shalimar UMC for Holy Week will include these contrasts and emotions of Holy Week. We invite you to attend, bring, and invite others as we share this journey which will include our Tuesday Lenten Lunch at 12:00 pm, Pastor's Class Wednesday at 6:00 pm, Maundy Thursday worship at 7:00 pm, Good Friday worship at 7:00 pm, Holy Saturday at 6:00 pm. Our Easter Services will be at 8:00, 9:30, 9:37, 11:00 and 11:07 am. Remember also our children's ministry is hosting the Easter Fest rain or shine on Holy Saturday as well. What an eventful week it will be and it needs to be! Consider all Jesus went through because he loved us and our world!

We look forward to seeing everyone this Holy Week!
