# Philip's Focus

## We Have Reason to Hope... God Is at Work for the Future of the Church

In the coming months and years, we may well have consternation about the upcoming General Conference in 2019 for the United Methodist Church. There is a meeting in our area this week that will address some of these concerns and challenges. As we have people in our congregation planning to attend, I'm sure this meeting of the Wesley Covenant Association will spark some conversations in our church. This will be one of many kinds of meetings of this type on the road to General Conference. My guess is this meeting will also prompt more meetings throughout our denomination on every side of the controversial issues. Let me say to you as your Lead Pastor we do have challenges ahead! Our hope is always in God and He is at work. Let us be in prayer for all in leadership in the United Methodist Church. Let us pray for the Commission On A Way Forward, Council of Bishops, and the upcoming 2019 General Conference.

In the coming months, we can anticipate that there will be all kinds of ideas and information about what is best for the church. Most of the conversations will be about keeping the current language of the Book of Discipline or possible changes regarding some controversial issues. We need not be surprised at all that these issues will continue to be debated. Regardless of debate, protest, defiance, or whatever...our current position in the *Book of Discipline* has not changed. The wording of the Discipline prohibits practicing gays and lesbians from ordination and also prohibits same gender weddings being held in our churches and being officiated by our pastors. We know some have chosen to ignore the Discipline but this does not change our official position. Only the General Conference can make changes.

Our military and nation have also been having these same types of conversations for years...so this is nothing new. These issues have been debated my entire forty years of ministry. Why am I hopeful for the future of the church? The United Methodist Church? And Shalimar United Methodist Church? Let me share with you some of the hope I see.

The Church has endured struggles and trials in the past. In fact, historically the church has grown in such turbulent times. The Church has endured wars, social changes, and controversies. I'm hopeful, for God holds the future of the Church and the Church will not only survive we will thrive. I'm also hopeful for we have the power of the Holy Spirit to empower us. The Holy Spirit galvanizes the Church through such times as these for greater ministry in the future. As we continue to teach and live the Scriptures, and make a commitment to prayer... we are primed to move into the future where God is leading. God has a future for the Church. We only need to get in step with what He is seeking to do.

My hope is strong for the Church when I think of how we are making disciples now at Shalimar UMC. This is our main focus following the Great Commission of Jesus. Our future plans are to develop leadership so that our discipleship capacity can increase.

I'm hopeful because the world needs Jesus and we have His good news to share with the world. Our church at Shalimar is primed to make more disciples. The only thing that prevents us from making disciples of Jesus Christ is getting sidetracked with distracting issues. Let us keep controversial issues in proper perspective...our main purpose is "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world!" Let's not get side tracked on other issues. Let's not let that happen! Let's make disciples right now! And in the future! Our children and youth we disciple now will impact generations to come!

At Shalimar we have a tradition of being a team player with the Conference and District. In these days we especially want to support our connection. Why? We can impact more people for Christ through our connection than we could ever influence as a solo church. There is greater fruitfulness possible through our United Methodist Church with our connection to thousands of churches nationally and globally. As United Methodists, we do impact millions. As a result of this let us be in prayer for our Bishop, Conference, and the greater work of United Methodism. In times such as these, we need to be in prayer for all!

Since 1951, Shalimar UMC has a tradition of being a beacon for Jesus Christ. We have some wonderful master planning going on... so that... disciples of Jesus Christ can be made for present and future generations. Let's make this time and this era the most fruitful in Shalimar UMC history. Let us all recommit our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness!

Let us move forward trusting God so that the best days of Shalimar UMC are ahead. Imagine reaching 1000 people in discipleship classes by 2023, when the Haverty's space becomes available. In addition to work we know, God will place before Shalimar UMC opportunities we do not even see yet. How exciting!

Will you join me in moving forward trusting God. Let's not miss the present opportunities as what we are doing now impacts future ministry! And yes, most of all... God is at work... revival is coming, and the future is in God's Hands! We only need to join God's future for the church! Let us join with our Bishop David Graves in saying... "The best is yet to come." God is at work in the Church and the future is bright! Let it be so!

# This Week's Guide for Groups & Individuals

## Foolproof Week 7: A Foundation of Asking

The Golden Rule, which Matthew 7:12 is called, is a concept that was native to Judaism and has been a part of every major religion in some form or another. Confucius said something very similar. This is a beautiful verse and something that every Christian can live by. But have we taken it to an extreme that has hurt Christianity?

Acceptance is when we receive something, or join into something, like a group, cause, or mindset. Tolerance, on the other hand, is the willingness to deal with opinions that one does not agree with. In America over the past 100 years, Christians have had to become tolerant that is for sure, but have we transitioned into acceptance of those who don't share our faith?

Here are some questions for you to consider when thinking about the Golden Rule in our context today:

- 1) With the Golden Rule in mind, should I be acceptant or tolerant?
- 2) Does it hurt our Christian witness to be acceptant of non-Christians? Why or why not?
- 3) How can I love others as I want to be loved that are different from me?
- 4) Is there someone of a different faith or culture that I can get coffee or lunch with this week just to learn more about?
- 5) What is something God is showing me about this passage this week?
