

# Philip's Focus

#### The Shalimar Beacon Moves Into the Future

The Webster dictionary defines beacon as a "fire or light to signal ahead." The Shalimar Beacon has for decades signaled the good news for the people of Shalimar United Methodist Church of what is just ahead. The methods of communications have changed since the beginning of Shalimar UMC 67 years ago. The need to communicate effectively has never been more important. In 2018, there are so many ways to connect and we desire to effectively communicate the good news of our church. With so many ways to stay informed today, we want to be good stewards and reduce costs when possible. In this new era of communication, we seek to be progressive and enhance our methods. After all, we are "Methodists" and we want to be good stewards of the best methods.

Decades ago, our church secretary would, with great anxiety each month, print the Beacon on a mimeograph machine. One wrong move and the Beacon, back then, would have had wrinkles, smudges, and if too wrinkled and smudged would have to be redone from scratch! The evolution of the copying machine made printing all the Beacons more feasible on a weekly basis. This has been our primary method for decades. As our world around us has shifted to use digital media, our costs for printing a Beacon for all of our worshippers each week has continued to increase.

A few weeks ago at our recent staff retreat, we determined the time is now to communicate more effectively with our congregation and community. One of the ways we identified was to better utilize the opportunity of the weekly Beacon. Our congregation and world has been shifting to digital media for years. As a result, many of our printed Beacons are left behind each weekend in our pews and chairs. At a recent Trustees meeting, this waste of printing materials was brought to our attention. Our staff has also noticed this trend in recent years.

As a result of seeking to fully utilize the resource of digital media and being good stewards of church resources, we are beginning a process of updating the methods for the weekly Beacon. Our process will begin with the following goals. **First**, the Beacon will continue to be published and updated weekly and will be available as an online version through the Church website. This online version will continue to feature higher quality photos and design that are cost prohibitive with printed media. Our church will continue to be sensitive to those without computer access and will provide a limited number of printed copies of the web version of the Beacon. **Second**, a Worship Guide will be printed each week for our worship services and distributed for worshippers.

**Third**, we will continue to expand our use of digital media when possible to "signal the light" of the news of Shalimar to more people than ever before! **Fourth**, we will seek to be good stewards in this process saving the church thousands of dollars in printing costs. This will also help our tireless administrative staff. Less printing will greatly enhance their focus of other important duties. **Fifth**, our *Worship Guide* will be more guest friendly with a goal of drawing newcomers into our church. We are anticipating more first time visitors in our church this year! **Sixth**, we are asking you to help us with this transition as the Beacon moves into the future with our church growing forward! We understand this will be a work in progress and will not be perfect. Please help us reach this goal of more effective communication and better utilizing church resources.

The name Beacon does capture the hopes of this transition. We seek to signal the good things just ahead in the life of our church! The methods will change but the message will be the same. We seek to shine the light of Jesus as a Beacon in this community!
