

ANNUAL THANKSGIVING CAMPAIGN

"Let us not love with words or speech but with action and truth" 1 John 3:18

Did you know that within our church we have a mission called The Faith Backpack Program? Since 2008, over 35 faithful members support this mission with their time and talents to ease weekend hunger of children attending Shalimar Elementary and Meigs Middle School.

These children are identified through their school's guidance department as a high risk for food insecurity. Each week during the school year, our volunteers pack 79 bags containing two meals and deliver them to the schools. Knowing these children have food for the weekend is a huge comfort and often carries them over until school lunches resume the following week.

The funding for this mission does not come from the churches annual budget. It is funded by private donations from the incredible members of our church over and above their annual giving.

Beginning November 12th through Thanksgiving weekend, we are launching our annual campaign to support one child for \$150.00 per year. What does \$150.00 buy? 2 meals per week, 8 meals per month for 8 months for one child! That's an average of 79 meals for only \$18.76 per month!

The last two years hunger campaign has served as proof of this congregation's love and selflessness! What a blessing any donation contributed, in any amount, will be for a child who suffers with daily food insecurities due to no fault of their own.

Blessings to each of you during this Thanksgiving Holiday and all year long – you are loved and appreciated!

We are excited to introduce **Blessings for Children**, a new outreach Missions ministry of Shalimar UMC, that will involve our entire church family. Initial donations of our needed items will be received Sundays, November 11th and 18th, in the Family Life Center and sanctuary narthex, and also every 3rd Sunday of the month in those same locations. 





Colder Weather Means Shelter for the Homeless

When the weather gets cold, the needs of the homeless people in our area change. It can be a threat to life and health when they are exposed to the harsher elements. Several FWB area churches have come together to cooperatively address this need. Our Cold Night Shelter ministry is designed to spring into action whenever the temperature gets too frigid.

When the weather report predicts overnight temperatures below 40 degrees, the Cold Night Shelter is opened. Each church is responsible for running the shelter on a different night. Shalimar UMC is designated to help out on Saturday nights. As the homeless come to the shelter, we feed them supper, help with their laundry, and provide cots for them to sleep on. Our Chef Heyward has graciously prepared and frozen food ahead of time. The Seventh Day Adventist church hosts them for Sunday breakfast.

We need servants to be ready to help anytime a Saturday night gets cold. Because of the nature of the ministry, we do not know how many nights during the winter we will need to help. Some years we have no Saturday nights below forty; other years we have several. We will have three teams of seven (ideally six men and one woman) to work in three shifts (5 to 10 pm, 10 pm to 3 am, and 3 to 7 am).
